
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A Voice from the Heart...

About Us

You have known us for over 18 years now. SMILE is a registered charitable organization whose mission is to work with underprivileged children and their parents. We continue to groom personalities and change lives for the betterment of those children and the families that we work with.

Since SMILE was found in 1997, we have worked with thousands of families, underprivileged children and women, senior citizens, and also many urban and rural schools in Gujarat and Maharashtra.

SMILE is a platform for enlightening as many as we can through our projects UDAAN, UTKARSH and UMANG.

UDAAN, a project started in 1997, is oriented towards children with its core motive of making them settled and happy individuals. In this process of shaping their careers, we hold ourselves responsible for their education, extracurricular activities, nurturing their talent, and providing opportunities and resources to help them advance in their chosen career path.

Besides basic education, we started our own Montessori school in 2003 for toddlers aged between 2 and 6 years old. Being the only Montessori school for underprivileged children in South Mumbai has given us an advantage of having a waiting list of 8 to 10 children each year. The struggle we initially faced to convince parents to get their little children educated from an early age has finally yielded fruit.

Women from lower socio-economic backgrounds are caught within the four walls of their homes. They are under a lot of stress from their household responsibilities but they still want to give their children the best education possible. Most of these women are illiterate or with limited elementary level education. They have time constraints due to multiple responsibilities on their home front. At SMILE we work around these constraints by teaching them skills that they can quickly master and readily apply to generate a sizeable and

sustainable income for themselves and their families. We aim to change their personalities through various workshops and programs. We also aim to make them physically fit through yoga and dance, and help them earn a respectable living through our Income Generation program.

Back in 2008, SMILE had started its initiative of catering to the underprivileged in rural India. Starting with one rural project in Ratnagiri, SMILE has now adopted 10 schools in Gujarat and Maharashtra, with nearly 4000 beneficiary students during the academic year 2014-2015. It has been one of our greatest achievements that is in sync with our values.

Project UDAAN began in 1997 with a handful of street and slum children. Today, this project works towards breaking the cycle of poverty by providing higher secondary education to underprivileged children. In our endeavour, we have successfully adopted and partnered with eight schools, with around 3500 impoverished children. UDAAN is a project that envisions bringing socio-economic transformation in the Indian society by educating less fortunate children.

Our Projects

At SMILE we do this by providing not only education, school fees and scholastic material but also a better environment, access to better healthcare, and exposure and opportunity to be recognized in public. We also organise workshops for talent development, entertainment activities, personality development and much more.

Being aware that children are our country's greatest resource, the UDAAN project intends to ensure and support children's complete development that is mentally, physically, socially, spiritually and economically, liberating and equipping them as they open up to their full potential.



Our Projects

SPONSORSHIP PROJECT

For hundreds of underprivileged children in India finding a job that pays well is close to impossible as they lack the skills required. Despite having intelligence and skills, they often even lack the language and presentation skills for desired jobs.



SMILE's Sponsorship Project ensures every child receives support through every phase of his or her young life. This project invites donors to help children swim through the hurdles of their lives. The funds raised through our Sponsorship Project helps a child by paying school fees, providing educational material like books, bags, stationary, and tuition classes. The overall development of the child is also supported by organising educational workshops, expert talks, outings, and hosting extracurricular activities like dance and karate. The Sponsorship Project also helps the overall needs of the family.

MONTESSORI

SMILE's Montessori school is the only Montessori school in South Mumbai for underprivileged children aged between 2 and 6 years old. Our Montessori school is based on the principles of Maria Montessori that cater to the practical and holistic based education. Started in 2003, we have close to 250 children who have graduated from our Montessori school to pursue further education. Even today we have a waiting list of 8 to 10 children each year.



Our Projects

UTKARSH

Women continue to be constrained by India's patriarchal society. Many have little or no access to education or basic health services. Though they are working hard all day to solve their family problems, they have often lost their own identity in this process. They no longer have any motivation or anything positive for themselves.



Project UTKARSH aims at training and providing such women with opportunities of selfemployment to improve their socio-economic status, help them identify themselves and improve their quality of life. Efforts are made to empower women socially, culturally and economically. They are also provided with much needed space for leisure, entertainment and celebration. Several programmes are undertaken in this project.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Children in rural India suffer from a lack of basic educational amenities, opportunities to learn and demotivated school officials. Even though they might be intelligent, the lack of resources weighs them down. Many even have to work alongside with their parents due to financial constraints. The parents themselves are sceptical as to whether their child will do better in school or not. Education is not given its due importance.



Through our research we found a lot of problems present in the rural education system. Convincing parents to let their children attend school, listening to the woes of school trustees, and observing the unwelcoming environment we were determined to make a change. Now we have successfully started two rural projects in Ratnagiri District (Panwal Village) and partnered with one school in Wada (Thane) as well as four schools in Gujurat. It has been a proud achievement that is also in line with our mission and goals for SMILE.

The bright side is that these children are street-smart; quick to absorb knowledge and hungry for more! School trustees who were previously disheartened by the lack of amenities are provided with all of the basic schooling facilities by SMILE. We aim to build a smarter India, one that gives a child the opportunity to shine as much as in rural villages as there are chances in urban cities.

Additional Educational Support

As children progress in school, the difficulty level of their schoolwork increases. Students face higher amounts of tension, stemming from a pressure to cope with the faster paced school curriculum to peer pressure. Moreover the parents of these children cannot help them with their academic problems because they themselves are not very educated. But they dream of educating their children, for which they work day and night. It is this reason that SMILE started its Group Tuition Class to help children solve their difficulties.

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When we started our project UDAAN in 1997, we first laid the foundation of providing education to street and slum children. We helped children secure admission to schools and helped them with their studies through our expert teachers. We also helped them with other hurdles ranging from language barriers, learning, and basic writing.



Additional Group Tuition Classes for our children

Today we have forty children regularly attending tuition classes run at SMILE's day care centre and at our administrative office. Students from Standard 1 to Standard 9 are taught across all mediums. For those who are appearing for their Board examinations, we have made sure to enrol them for private tuition classes, for extra help to secure a higher percentage. We conduct extra maths classes for our students to make them competitive in this increasingly challenging world. We also conduct English tuitions for our students, which provide them with a cushion to improve their command over the language.

Our teachers do more than just aim for improving academic performance. They also play a significant role in the shaping our children's future. The teachers guide them efficiently so as to raise their confidence level and accelerate their studying procedure. Additional attention is given as well as imparting knowledge and awareness to each child. Children discuss their ideas and opinions with more freedom in class. Hence it helps them explore different subjects thoroughly.

The result of these efforts is having our students pursue career options like engineering, medicine and the like. Moreover we have witnessed 100% pass results every year and 70% of children pass with above 80% marks.

Working with Schools

Since the very beginning, we have been associated with various schools of South Mumbai. These include Bhagini Kala Mandir (English), Our Lady of Dolors (English), Marwari Vidyalaya (Hindi), Aryan School (Marathi), Seva Sadan School (Marathi) and Sharda Ashram School for Girls (Marathi). We also have a close connection with Vikas Vidyalaya School which caters to the needs of deaf and mute children. Through this association we provide educational assistance in terms of books, school fees and stationery to the children going to these schools. These schools have been our partners since SMILE's inception.

Support for Children Belonging to Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes

Since the past 8 years, we have been sponsoring scheduled tribes and scheduled castes from Seva Sadan and Sharda Mandir School from the primary and secondary sections. And in the last two years we added seven more schools in Gujarat and Maharashtra under our umbrella. We have Vahanvati Vidhyalaya, Takshashila Madhyamic Vidhyalaya and Saraswati Vidhyalaya from Gandhinagar associated with us.

At the above mentioned schools, we provide these institutes with necessary educational infrastructure to equip their library, laboratory, computer labs, etc. For the children; we provide them with school fees, stationary, uniforms, etc. The children are also provided with appropriate healthcare through our nutritional projects.

Programs During the year

Stress Buster Party

April is that time of the year when school kids feel stress free. Final examinations are over in almost all schools and the new academic session is yet to start.

We too at SMILE treat the kids with time to relax and re-energize. A special Stress Buster Party is the tradition SMILE has been following for over 15 years. For the past two years this program is fully organized, managed, anchored and presented by the children's parents. The program this year was based on the theme "Comedy with SMILE". All the performances that majorly included role-playing were comic based. Moreover, to encourage the children's parents, this was a competition- entertainment program where

two winners were declared based on the best script and delivery of the act. That evening we only heard our children's giggles and laughter echoing through the hall. The children and parents were served with yummy snacks to satisfy their tastebuds!

To fully utilise the study-free time, during the summer vacations, before the kids go back for their next academic year, we decided to gather all the children to showcase a movie. Movies when seen in a group are more fun than seen alone! As the saying goes; the more the merrier! 


You will be surprised by what a child can get done in one minute when faced with an

Some of the items that our children made were airplanes from a plastic bottle, a dancing doll from a Colgate packet, a beach scene in a shoe


box, a pot from waste bangles, etc.

Developing a child's handwriting skill is very important. All of our SMILE children enthusiastically participated in an English Handwriting Competition that was organized by SMILE under the judgement of Mr. Anil Chauhan who is an expert in analysing handwriting and also conducts many handwriting workshops.

Handwriting Workshop at BKM School

In today's age of technology that revolves around mobile phones, tablets, and laptops, children seem to want these cool gadgets as badly as they need food and shelter! In most advanced schools today, teaching is delivered through audio-visual aids. Children also tend to learn through apps on iPads and similar electronic devices. To highlight and bring the focus back to handwriting at such times, we organized a handwriting workshop at B.K.M. High School under the expertise of Mr. Anil Chauhan.

Formation of letters, writing in Hindi and English, and precise movement of the pencil were some other things he concentrated upon. It was an enlightening lecture for the students as well as the teachers of the school!

With its emphasis on critical thinking, effective communication, independent research and teamwork, debate teaches skills that serve individuals well. Skills learned in debate can be used in school, in the workplace and in fulfilling children's responsibilities as citizens of democratic societies.

With the most loved topic of children, "Technology - Its Advantages and

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Disadvantages," we were amazed to see different sides of the same issue. The children could very well prosecute and object their views on how technology has served them for the better or for the worse.

The competition started with a display of flashcards with missing words, which was then succeeded by the actual debate. Children spoke about every form of technology they were aware of, be it mobiles, laptops, rocket science and so on.

Puppet Making Workshop (4 weeks)

The traditional practice of employing puppets to educating children has been

used in SMILE for the last two years. We have been conducting a four session puppet workshop whose aims are:

- ✓ To introduce the importance of puppets
- To teach preparation and manipulation of various materials to prepare a puppet
- ✓ To prepare educational scripts for puppet theatre
- ✓ To perform in front of an audience using the puppets and a script





SPONSORSHIP

All children are born with equal intelligence, but some are not provided with the same opportunities and resources. They need an education which is the foundation for their development and growth. With these thoughts in mind, SMILE has launched an educational project called the "Child Sponsorship Project."

The sponsorship project involves working with not just the child but also their family, their school principal, and teachers. This is important as the family and school environment are primary factors that influence a child. The two main eligibility criterions SMILE looks for in order for a child to be sponsored are his/her desire to study and the degree of his/her financial instability.

Once the child has been selected for our sponsorship, the amount of money he or she has been sponsored with is directly funded to paying fees, providing educational material like books, bags, and stationary, and tuition classes, all to help the child. We employ the usage of audio-visual aids like drama, role-play and puppets to teach our children.

But it doesn't only stop at that, we also provide with them with all the resources necessary to shape their personality. This is done by giving them all the necessary tools and chances to shine. Whether it is the numerous educational workshops or outings organised, we want each child's personality to flourish. We arm them with extra-curricular activities and interests like Karate, Dance and Sports.


Today, we have over two hundred children in our sponsorship project attending seven different schools of South Mumbai in English, Hindi or Marathi medium. All of our sponsored children are heading towards successful academic careers.

It is extremely rewarding for us to see a child get educated and have a good future. Through years of experience we can proudly say that our children have been good achievers at school and at the college level. These children go out into the world as confident and independent citizens.



In India, our educational system operates via crowded government school classrooms, and teachers teaching curriculum by the book with little to no application of their learning. The situation is even worse for people who come from a lower socio-economic background.

What is required is an educational model where a child plays an active role in his or her own learning. With this mission in mind, SMILE started what is right now the only Montessori School available for the underprivileged in South Mumbai. The entire teaching process of the school is based on the Montessori principle: that student should play an active role in their learning to apply concepts learned in the classroom. The school and its teachers are AMI recognised and certified.

Under this mode of educating our toddlers, we conduct several exercises and introduce material that is familiar to the child as well as an extension of their own home environment. All activities are carried out by the child under the guidance of teachers. Through this, children are able to fine tune motor movements that help in the development of social skills, independence and coordination of movement.

With Sensorial, we cater to the five senses of the child: visual, olfactory, auditory, taste and touch. The children are able to define each one of their senses through this program, and with that, are more aware and appreciative of the various objects present in their surroundings. For the very same purpose, we held activities like colour beads patterns, pink tower with further exercise, cylinder blocks, brown stairs, shape tray, colour boxes, touch boards, sorting box, binomial cubes etc.

Language

Language is worked on right from the time a child enters our SMILE Montessori School. Language capabilities of a child are built by constant conversations with the child. SMILE staff also provides our kids with precise names for objects in our school and community. Storytelling and conversations that employ verbs, nouns, prepositions, actions, words, nursery rhymes, alphabet and tracing alphabet help develop the child's linguistic skills. Our students are eventually able to build reading and writing skills once they have learned basic vocabulary and grammar.

MONTESSORI

Arithmetic

Our arithmetic studies focus on developing the ability of the child to calculate and judge. The children are able to gradually understand values and quantities in a logical pattern. We use various math games, such as number rod exercises, to help students learn Math.

Exposure and Celebrations

Celebrating festivals allows children to enjoy special foods, sing songs, and have a blast. Festivals and events that took place at SMILE's Montessori school throughout the year include Independence Day, Raksha Bandhan, Ganesh Chaturthi, Diwali, Christmas, Makar Sankranti and Republic Day. The general atmosphere in the school also becomes festive when children are allowed to come to school in festive attire.

Working with Parents



Parents' Meeting to keep them updated about their children's progress

Parents are the bridge between what a child learns at the school and what he learns at home. Hence not merely teachers but both the parent and the teacher become collaborators working together to support a child's growth and learning.

We organize various educational meetings which are designed to help parents understand the concepts and philosophy of Montessori learning. Coming from a basic-educated background, they are given a brief overview about what the child will learn at school and the benefits of a Montessori education.

Parents' meeting are conducted every quarter to give parents the opportunity to discuss the development of their child. These meetings are conducted by the Montessori teacher and involve samples of the child's work and discussion of the curriculum appropriate for them.

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SMILE's project UTKARSH aims at helping underprivileged women break free from their cycle of poverty and financial dependence on family members. We teach them valuable practical skills in order for them to earn a living. As a part of this initiative, we conduct various workshops to encourage their talents and help them develop new skills to further supplement their income. This is done through our Income Generation Program where, after receiving vigorous training, finished products and goods made by our ladies are sold at exhibitions. The money collected from the sales is then given to these ladies for their hard work and commitment to make an earning.

Besides this, we also provide counselling and support to women when they are struggling, left to take care of themselves, or are stressed out. Health and entertainment are taken care of through our other programs as well.

All in all, Project UTKARSH gives our women a voice and a support network to nurture their hopes and ambitions, allowing them the freedom to work towards their own individual dreams.

Self Defence

One of the many new initiatives that we took up for women this year included selfdefence classes. The focus of this training was mainly to do with women taking charge in life's difficult situation like robbery, physical attacks, and threats. Under the guidance of Sadanand Padma Sir (one of the reputed instructors from Yudanshakai Karate International), twelve women underwent this intensive course for a period of two months. They were taught various exercises of this form of martial arts and meditation.

Besides this, meditation has helped them to become more positive towards every approach in life.

Dance Class

Dance has been therapeutic media for our women. They found it not only entertaining but also a break from their daily routine and stressed life. For them, dance has now become their stress buster.

RURAL PROJECT

Education is a very basic and important necessity. However it is not appropriately addressed in rural India. SMILE through its extensive research found out about the various problems faced in rural education procedures and decided to take action. These problems ranged from school officials who were unhappy with the infrastructure and amenities, to parents who weren't well educated enough to understand the need for an education for their children. Educational standards in rural India just weren't up to the mark.

The children may be bright and intelligent but as long as they don't receive the proper infrastructure necessary to shine in an educational environment, then all of it goes to waste. SMILE faced a lot of challenges in its path. Parents who weren't convinced that their children would do well in school, incomplete school structures, unplastered classrooms, and dilapidated furniture. Schools didn't even receive government grants that were promised to them in the first place.

RURAL PROJECT

But SMILE decided to step in and take matters into our own hands. We have now started two rural projects in Ratnagiri District (Panwal Village) and partnered with one school in Wada (Thane) as well as four schools in Gujurat. This has been a very proud achievement for us. The children are well-looked after and they are shining in their respective classrooms. Meanwhile the school trustees are happy with the refurbished classrooms and sound infrastructure provided by SMILE.

We also provided for the children's school fees, stationary, bags and uniforms. SMILE endeavours to do its best for the development for education in rural India and will continue to do so for years to come. All of this was done to ensure a smarter and brighter future for rural India!


New Year, New Initiatives

This test is conducted by taking finger prints of an individual. This reveals the personality, learning skill, thinking style and intelligent quotient.

SMILE conducts the DMIT test and has partnered with Your Time Service.

The main objectives of the DMIT test is to solve the psycho-social problems among children, to solve adjustmental problems, build harmonious social relationships and increasing satisfactory performances in children by identifying their inborn intelligence potentials.

By DMIT analysis, we help parents understand their child's personal inborn intelligence level and their strengths and weaknesses. After the test, we provide professional intensive counselling to parents about the report. During counselling, SMILE guides parents to choose activities or careers according to their inborn intelligence (or DMIT results). We show them the strengths of their child and their personality styles and help them to better understand their child's potential. The DMIT test also serves the purpose of "building harmonious social relationships" by being able to help a parent understand his or her own child's psychology, behaviour, and performance level.





Adoption of School in Wada

This year, SMILE spread its horizon to help a school that comprises of an Adivasi tribe and resides in Wada, which is located 40 kilometres from Thane. This rural patch in India struggles to acquire the most basic of amenities.

The school in reference, Shikshanpremi Gangaram Mahadu Bhadange Vidyalaya, is in Vaki. The institution was established in 2008 and was granted permission by the government to be developed into a school. It educates students from standard 8th to 10th only. The school provides education for close to 200 students.

Though the school was promised grants from the government, they never received the grant money promised. Even with these financial crises, this school is the only source of secondary education of the children in

the village as well as students from the nearby villages. They come to school from houses that are 4-5 kilometres away with no means of transportation. Their day starts and ends with this tiring journey to and from school. What adds to this is that they do not even have the footwear necessary to walk this long and arduous journey.

That is when SMILE decided to step in. We provided complete furnishing of the classrooms right from wall plastering to furniture restoring. Additional classrooms were also constructed to accommodate the staggering number of children who wanted to be educated. We also provided the school with an equipped laboratory and library. The school playground was revamped to make the space suitable for sports and other events that may take place.

Besides infrastructural support, SMILE also provides for the school fees, books, stationary, bags and any clothing material they could put to use. In other words, this school has been adopted by SMILE. SMILE is committed to making the school an acceptable place for education.
